You have to *talk* quietly.

You don't have to *talk* loudly.

Albert has to *turn off* his mobile phone.
He doesn't have to *send* messages.



Susan has to *turn* off her mobile phone.
She does not have to *make* calls during the
movie.



We don't have
to *put* our feet
up on the seat.
