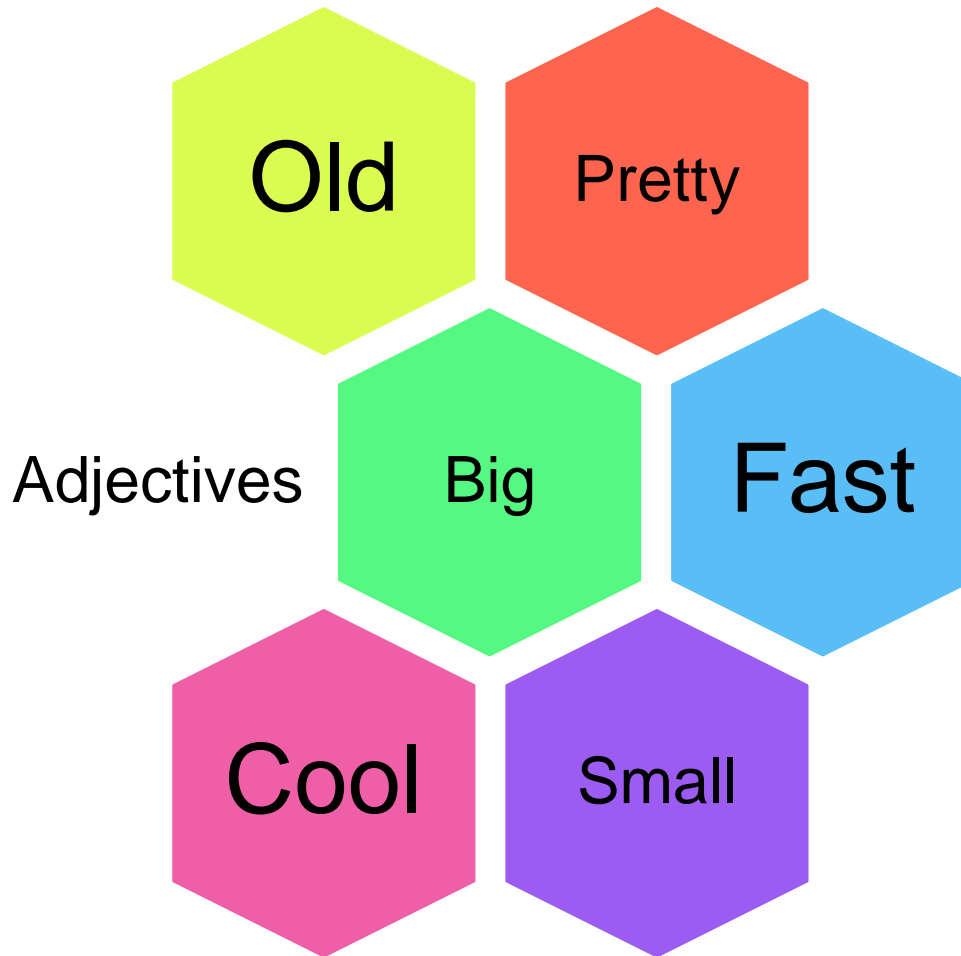

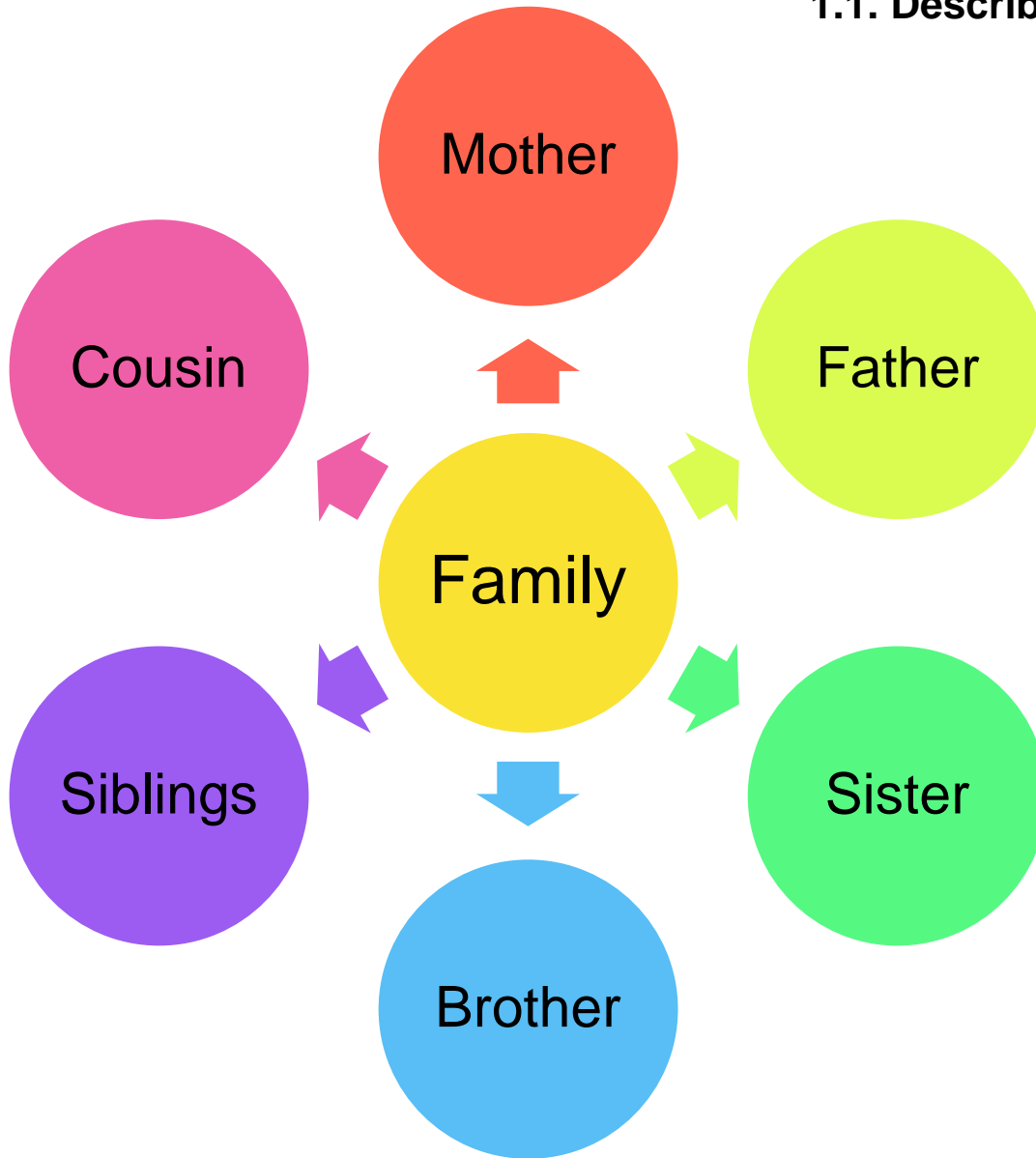

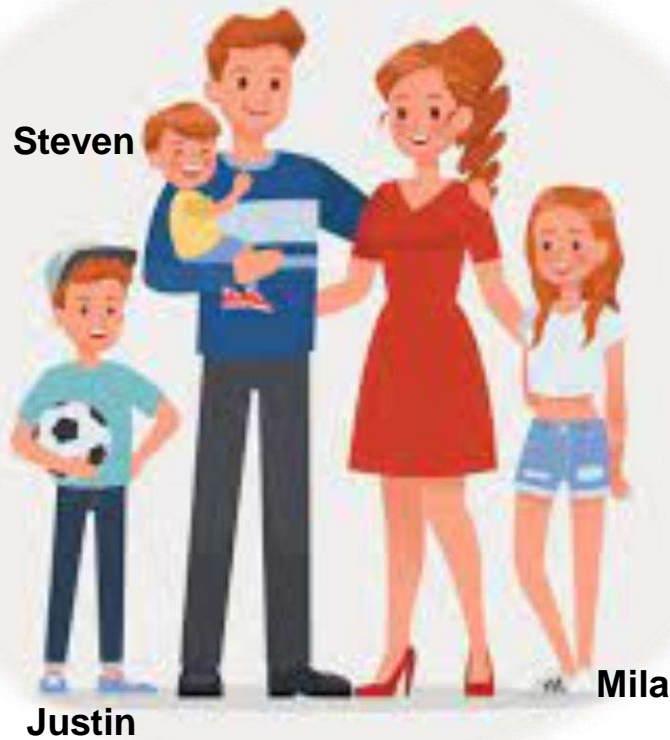


1.1. Describing my family and friends



Adjective: Old

Who is older?



Maggy is **older than** her brother.

Mom is **older than** Mila.

Dad is **older than** Justin.



1.1. Describing my family and friends



One-syllable words

We usually add *-er* and *-est*

If an adjective **ends in -e**, we add *-r* or *-st* :

Adjective	Comparative	Superlative
Old	Old er	Old est
Long	Long er	Long est

Comparative: My brother is older **than** me.

Superlative: My brother is **the** oldest.

If an adjective **ends in a vowel and a consonant**, we **double** the consonant:

ADEJECTIVE	COMPARATIVE	SUPERLATIVE
big	bigger	biggest
fat	fatter	fattest

C: My dog is bigger **than** my cat.

S: my dog is **the** biggest pet.

We use **more / than** and **the most** to make comparatives and superlatives for most **two syllable adjectives** and for all adjectives with **three or more syllables**:

ADJECTIVE	COMPARATIVE	SUPERLATIVE
<i>careful</i>	<i>more careful</i>	<i>most careful</i>
<i>interesting</i>	<i>more interesting</i>	<i>most interesting</i>

C: My friend is **more** interesting **than** my sister.

S: My friend is **the most** interesting person in the world.
