Adjectives that end in -ed

- An adjective that ends in –ed is used to describe a feeling.

Jane is so **bored**.

Mike is **excited** because he will go to a concert tonight.



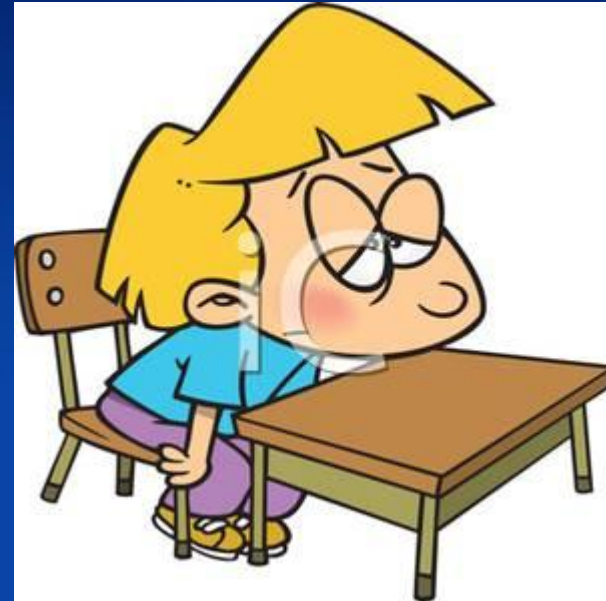

- Jane is so bored.

- Mike is excited because he found a dollar.



Adjectives that end in -ing

- An adjective that ends in **-ing** is used to describe a characteristic of a person or thing.

My girlfriend is **boring**.

The football match was very **exciting**! I really enjoyed it.

- My teacher is boring.



Example:

- The football match was exciting!



Important note:

- You can also find both adjectives in the same sentence.

I was **shocked** by how **shocking** the accident was last night.

Sally was **confused** by the **confusing** street signs in the city.
