

Editorial


The Mexican Bioethics Review is a publication of the Autonomous University of the State of Hidalgo to comply with the dissemination of bioethical knowledge.

On this occasion, works with the following themes are presented. The rights of patients, as a bioethical obligation of health personnel to guarantee respect for autonomy and in a full exercise of beneficence and non-maleficence. Information and communication technologies (ICT) are an opportunity to facilitate the provision of some health services through the collection of personal data; however, there is a duty to protect this data and avoid affecting the privacy of the person. For this reason, an article related to privacy control during the COVID-19 pandemic is presented.
