Editorial

The Mexican Journal of Bioethics is a publication of the Autonomous University of the State of Hidalgo for the dissemination of bioethical knowledge, from a multidisciplinary vision.

This issue addresses various topics related to bioethics. The types of responsibility in medical practice analyze the obligations of health personnel in activities such as medical care, considering that the principles of medical ethics and bioethics are part of the regulatory framework that governs the provision of this service. The issue of abuse in the consumption of antibiotics and the consequent emergence of antibiotic-resistant bacteria is addressed, which constitutes a bioethical dilemma that involves not only the medical community, but the entire society. Another article of interest is Bioethics and the care of the elderly, which sets out the duty of health professionals to comply with bioethical principles and ensure dignified care. Due to the multidisciplinarity of bioethics, a work is included on analyzing the factors or motivations that influence tourists to visit certain destinations, which, currently, are classified as Black Tourism, as well as the impact that this has generated in society, taking the Island of the Dolls in Xochimilco, Mexico City as an object of study. Finally, the relationship of Bioethics with the Inter-American Convention for the Protection of the Human Rights of Older Persons is reviewed, as an international regulatory instrument that helps guarantee respect for the dignity of this sector of the population.
