

## Editorial

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The purpose of the Journal of Basic and Applied Psychology Research is to create a space for the dissemination of scientific knowledge that allows those interested in the field of psychology, whether they are students, teachers, researchers or related professionals, to learn about research or studies conducted in our scientific discipline.

This issue of the journal was made up of contributions from researchers of the Instituto de Posgrado en Psicoterapia Cognitivo Conductual (IPPCC), the Universidad Autónoma del Estado de Hidalgo (UAEH) and the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM).

Among the topics addressed in this issue, the importance of Mental Health and the impact it has on it in different contexts were discussed. The first article presents a theoretical approach to the risk factors associated with suicidal behavior in adolescents. Several risk factors were found for the development of suicidal behavior in adolescents corresponding to the biological, psychological and social spheres of each individual. The second evaluated the psychological impact on university students in the state of Hidalgo, Mexico, during distance classes, after the confinement due to the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic, where it is shown that the cancellation of on-site classes at the institution where the young people studied was related to the presence of psychological symptoms associated with various problems. The third article aimed to identify psychological needs during the confinement due to the third wave of COVID-19 in university students, in order to design a specific intervention aimed at this population and contribute to their overall health. The fourth article sought to know the impact of the pandemic on the mental health of health personnel working in the first line of COVID-19 care, where it was found that the severity of the negative impact will depend on the self-care of health personnel and the care provided by their system. Finally, the fifth article sought to identify and understand the relationship between self-esteem and the possible existence of violence in partner relationships in young women between 18 and 24 years of age in the state of Hidalgo, and it was found that self-esteem is related to life experiences in the family and partner environment, stereotyped gender roles that denigrate women were identified, enabling patterns of vulnerability in their partner relationships, this through a mixed methodology.
