The Journal of Basic and Applied Psychology Research continues to promote the publication of research carried out in the field of Psychology, to be a space for scientific dissemination of excellence.

This number was integrated by contributions from researchers from the Autonomous University of the State of Hidalgo (UAEH), the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), the Autonomous University of Tamaulipas (UAT) and the National Institute of Criminal Sciences (INACIPE).

The articles in this issue reflect the concern of psychologists in the country to address issues of high relevance to Public Health from the perspective of Psychology, using a quantitative methodology, bibliometric analysis, and systematic review.

The first article provides a protocol for a psychological evaluation to be used in people who are candidates for hematopoietic stem cell transplantation. This contribution will undoubtedly be beneficial for psychologists working with this population and will mark a reference point on the need for relevant evaluations of the requirements of the hospitalized population. The second article contributes from the neurosciences to the understanding of aggressive behaviors in childhood and their relationship with executive functions in children, especially the role of the orbitofrontal zone. The third contribution deals with a bibliometric analysis of evidence-based interventions that have been carried out with parents of children with disabilities using Randomized Clinical Trials, highlighting the limited number of scientific publications accessible in this field. Finally, the fourth article reports an investigation that integrates the validation of an instrument to measure Burnout syndrome and the prevalence of this disease in a sample of Mexican workers, thus attending to an occupational Public Health problem.

We invite you to continue enriching the scientific dissemination of research in Psychology with your valuable contributions to the Journal of Basic and Applied Psychology Research.
