There are four dialects that belongs to this stage. North Tum Brian in the North of England, Mercian in Central England, Kentish in Southeaster England and West Saxon in southwestern England. It was spoken from the 5th to 11th centuries.

It is also known as Anglo-Saxon. There are some notable works from this stage: Beowulf, The Waner and The Seafarer and Caedom's Hymn (epic poems). It was influenced by Latin, Celtic Languages, and Norse Languages. Old English laid the foundation for the English language, with many of its words and grammatical structures are still visible in Modern English.

It was spoken from 11th to the 15th centuries, saw significant changes in the English language due various historical events and cultural influences.

Some of them are from the French language (prince, duke, parament), Latin, Norse languages, Greek, Italian and Arabic. Middle English was a transformative period for the English language, laying the groundwork for Early Modern English.
