Dentist

A dentist must have a specialty in: dentistry, dental surgery, or dental medicine.

They are responsible for communication between patients, their families, and doctors, as well as administering intravenous lines and medications prescribed by doctors.

To enter this profession, you need at a minimum an associate's degree in nursing or a diploma from an accredited nursing program along with a nursing license.

Health educator

Primary Duties: A health educator may work as part of a hospital, school, or nursing facility, teaching the public about the importance of hygiene and how to prevent the spread of disease from themselves to others.

A health educator must have a minimum of a bachelor's degree in health education or public health.

To advance in their field, some health educators earn their master's or doctorate in a specialized area of health education.

Nutritionist

Primary Duties: A nutritionist may work in many different settings, including hospitals, care facilities, clinics, schools, and organizations.

They assess a patient's dietary needs or restrictions and help create a meal plan that will provide the nutrients they need. Nutritionists may also be responsible for creating educational presentations to present in schools and other facilities.

A nutritionist must have at least a bachelor's degree in nutrition. Some advanced nutritionist positions may require a master's degree in nutrition or a related area.
