**FUTURE WILL**

Predictions (we think something will happen) **will + verb**

Example: He will be a good doctor.  
I believe they will win the match today.

**FUTURE GOING TO**

Decisions (taken before now - intentions / plans) **am/is/are + going to + verb**

Example: Are you going to watch TV tonight?  
I am going to buy a new car next month.

**PRESENT CONTINUOUS**

Plan (arrangements have been made) **am/is/are + verb ing**

Example: I'm flying to New York tomorrow morning.  
We are getting married next week.
