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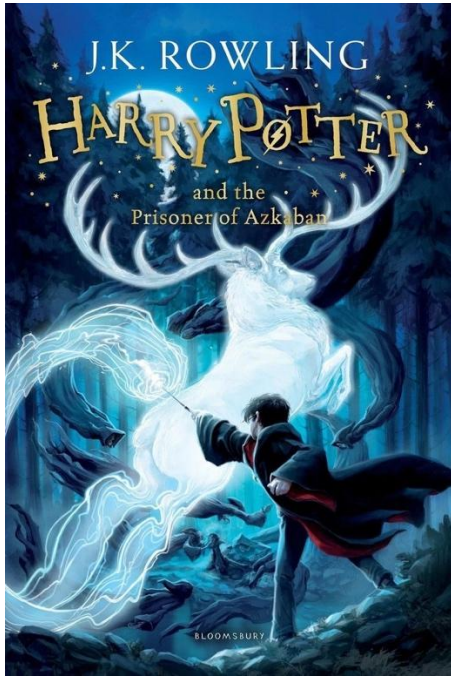


Figure 1. Portada del libro *Harry Potter y el prisionero de Askaban*
