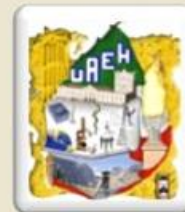


Last week you went to a party, a lot of your friends were there, here are some things they told you:...



- Patty: ‘I play golf regularly’
- Rosie: ‘I’m studying music in the afternoons’
- Matt: ‘I can’t believe you are here in the party, it has been ages’
- Wendy: ‘I’m getting married next year’

Today you meet your friends at school, you tell them about the party. You tell them what your friends said:

- Patty said that she played golf regularly
- Rosie said that she was studying music in the afternoons.
- Matt told me he couldn't believe I was there in the party, it had been ages
- Wendy said that she was getting married next year.

DESARROLLO DEL TEMA



When you are saying to somebody what someone said before, you are using ***REPORTED SPEECH...***

- When we use *reported speech*, the main verb of the sentence is usually *past*. We use a reporting verb, usually **say** or **tell** followed by *that*:
 - Patty said *that*...
- The rest of the sentence is usually *past* too:
 - ... she played golf regularly.

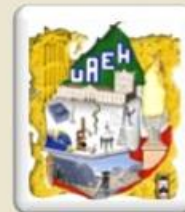

Say or Tell?



- Say: No indirect object.
 - Diana: ‘I’m tired’ / Diana **said that** she was tired.
- Tell: an indirect object.
 - Diana: ‘I’m tired, Ted’ / Diana **told Ted** that she was tired.
- But **say** something **to** somebody
 - Diana: ‘I’m tired’ / Diana **said to** me that she was tired.
